Title: Fellowship in Geriatric Nursing

Aim:

The course is designed to prepare registered nurses (B.Sc., P.B.B.Sc. or M.Sc.) with specialized knowledge, skills and attitude in providing advance quality care to older persons, their families, caregivers and communities at all the three levels of care.

Purpose:

The purposes of the course are to:

1. provide quality care to older persons.

3. 2. manage and supervise care of older persons at all the three levels of care.

teach nurses, allied health professionals, care providers and communities in

areas related to gerontological nursing.

4. conduct research in areas of gerontological nursing

Admission criteria:

The student seeking admission to this course should:

- 1. Be a registered nurse (RN & RM) or equivalent
- 2. Possess a minimum of work experience one year
- 3. Nurses from other countries must obtain an equivalence certificate
- 4. Be physically fit

- 6. Perform assessment of functional, physical, cognitive, psychological, social and spiritual status of older persons by using appropriate tools
- 7. Describe the modifications required for age friendly environment in home, community, clinics, institutions & community
- 8. Recognize and manage common health problems of older persons including geriatric syndromes
- 9. Appreciate the pharmacodynamics and pharmacokinetics related to common drugs used in disease condition of older persons
- 10. Use technology to enhance older person's functional independence and safety
- 11. Provide culturally appropriate end of life care to older persons
- 12. Teach and supervise nurses, allied health workers & caregivers in skills necessary to deliver care to older persons
- 13. Coordinate with key stakeholders in providing care to older persons in hospital and community
- 14. Identify the research priorities in gerontological nursing for evidence based practice & to conduct research
- 15. Demonstrate skills in management of geriatric services

- 6. Describe the concepts & principles of gerontological Nursing.
- 7. Describe Nursing process pertaining to geriatric care.
- 8. Explain concept & components of healthy ageing & role of the nurse in promoting active/healthy ageing

9. Describe characteristics of age friendly environment in home, institutions & community.

- 10. Explain principles of administration of drugs to older persons.
- 11. Apply nursing process in the management of common medical, surgical & psychiatric problems in older persons.
- 12. Identify older abuse & counsel old persons, families & community.
- 13. Provide culturally sensitive end of life care to older persons.

I. Procedures Assisted:

- Advanced life support
- Lumbar Puncture
- Arterial Blood Gas
- ECG Recording
- Arterial B P monitoring
- Blood transfusion
- IV cannulation & therapy
- Arterial catheterization
- Chest tube insertion
- Endotracheal intubation
- Ventilation
- Insertion of long line

II. Procedures Performed:

- Airway management a) Application of Oro Pharyngeal Airway b) Oxygen therapy c) Care of Tracheostomy d) Endotracheal Intubation
- Cardio pulmonary Resuscitation

- Monitoring clinically & with monitors, ECG
- Geriatric Nursing Assessment:
- Feeding management of OG tube insertion, gavage feeding, TPN
- Administration of drugs: I/M, IV injection, IV Cannulation & fixation infusion pump Calculation of dosages, monitoring fluid therapy, Blood administration.
- Procedures for prevention of infections: Hand washing, disinfections & sterilization, surveillance, fumigation
- Collection of specimens
- Setting, use & maintenance of basic equipment: ventilator, O2 analyzer, monitoring equipment, infusion pump,
- Use of assisting devices
- Physiotherapy, exercise program for older persons
- Helping older persons with mobility problems
- Communicating with older persons with hearing & visual problems
